
## Race to the BBQ

Having seen what's coming up, we try to pace ourselves but we can't help sampling the creamy hummus and tangy moutabal. We're not sorry we indulged, especially when our little ones come trotting up looking for a bit of flat bread.

Moving on from the salads, we especially love the flavourful sweet and sour prawns and the decadent penne carbonara. We don't find any specific kid food on offer, but our little ones find plenty they like including the chicken biryani, the steamed vegetables, the grilled fish and the range of fresh fruit.

We can't go to a barbeque without sampling one of everything as it comes off the grill. It's easy to overcook meat when you're working with an open flame, but the City Golf chefs keep on serving up flavourful chunks of chicken tikka, lamb chops and beef steak.
