Belgian Cafe

Offering a little piece of old Brussels right in the heart of Abu Dhabi, the Belgian Cafe in the InterContinental serves classic Belgian food, which basically means steaming pots of mussels, chunky fries and creamy mayonnaise, all washed down with a huge variety of traditional beverages.

There is such a dearth of Spanish restaurants in the capital that if you want some Tapas then your only real option is Bravo at the Sheraton Abu Dhabi – it's a good job then that this place does it so well.
